### Emergency Shelter

- 5.1. Establish permanent location (s) for year-round emergency shelter for men, women, and families (4).

### Temporary Housing

- 5.2. Establish other temporary housing strategies (e.g., legal camp site, scattered site tent/car camping, Oxford houses, etc.) (9).

### Entry into Permanent Housing

- 5.4. Facilitate entry into permanent housing among those experiencing homelessness or living in temporary housing (e.g. second chance rental classes, flexible financial assistance for move in costs, employment, rental assistance, etc.) (4).

### Day Time Drop-In Center

- 4.2. Establish a permanent site for Corvallis Day Time Drop-In Center & Stone Soup (8).

### Permanent Supportive Housing

- 5.7. Secure more permanent supportive housing for special populations (e.g. case management, mental health, substance abuse) (7).

### Behavioral / Mental Health

- ★ 3.6. Increase capacity to provide mental health treatment and detox services (1).

Supporting Activities:

- ★ 4.4. Strengthen partnerships with Law Enforcement and Mental Health to ensure mental health and other support needs are appropriately addressed (4).

### Comprehensive Care Coordination

- ★ 2.1. Increase capacity to provide for comprehensive, well-coordinated case management services aligned with health care transformation (2).
